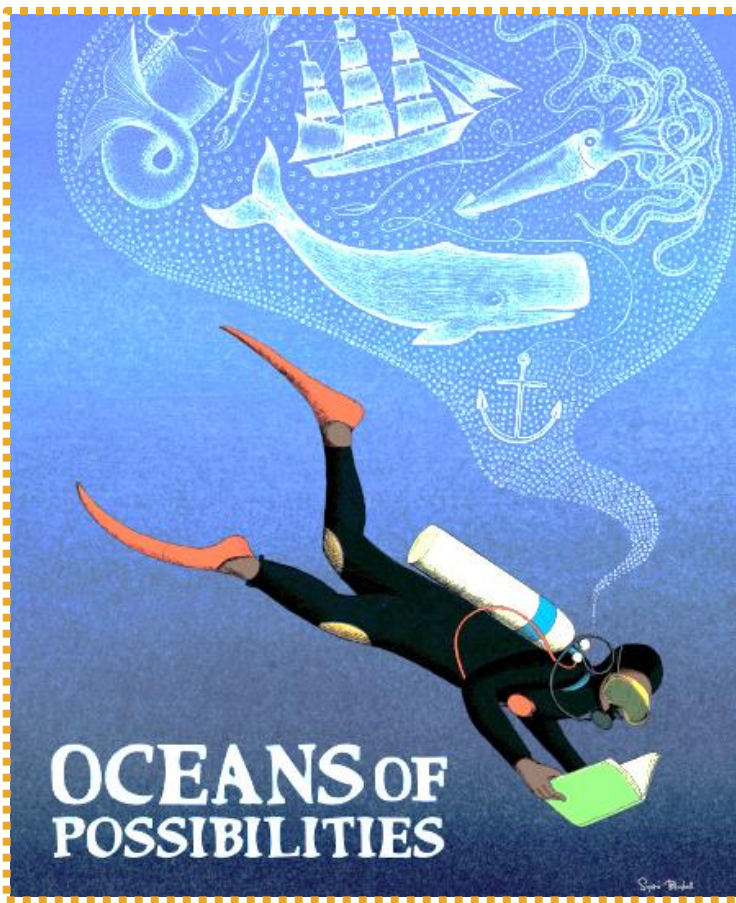

## All Together Now

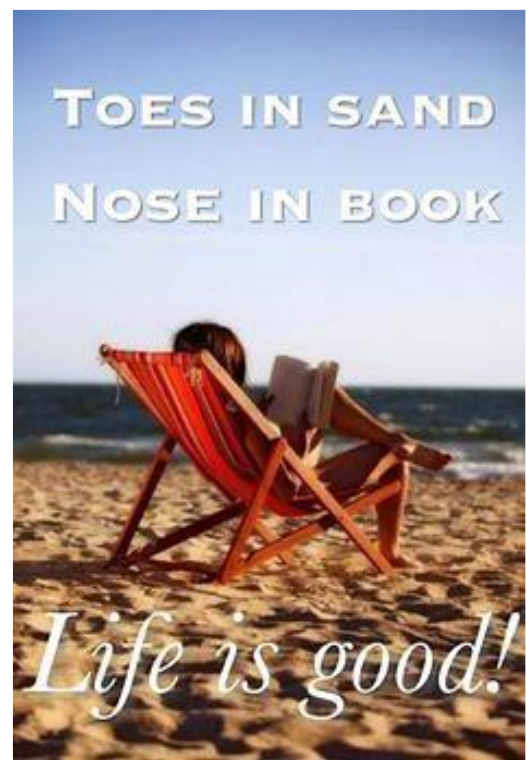

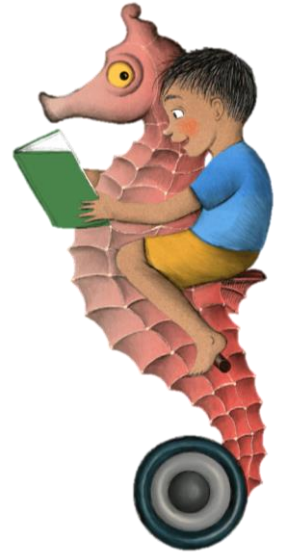
- You can participate on paper or digitally. If you pick up one of our paper flyers, color in the appropriate amount each time your child reads. Then bring your flyer when you stop by the library. We will record your information and get you a prize when it's time!
- If you want to track digitally, you can go online to [adairco.beanstack.org](http://adairco.beanstack.org) or get the free Beanstack Tracker app. Set up an account with our library, join the correct challenge and we will have your records right away. You will even be notified when you have a prize to pick up.
- Reading with your child counts. It builds listening skills and comprehension. Whether it's a bigger sibling, a grown up or an audiobook, count all of it as reading time!
- You cannot count reading UNTIL May 31st. Summer reading has to be done in the summer.
- If your child is in summer school and reads, that reading counts! Be sure to mark it down!
