It is the time of year when some of my favorite authors are releasing new books. One of those authors is Abbi Waxman with her new book. Christa Comes Out of Her Shell. Abbi Waxman has become one of my favorite authors; I have read all her books. In this one, Dr. Christa Barnet is working on a fictional island in the Indian Ocean studying sea snails when her mother calls to inform her that her long-presumed-dead father is alive. Christa is Christabel Liddle of the famous environmental family the Liddles. She was barely two when her father disappeared in Alaska and has no memory of him. With this news, her two older sisters and her mother require her presence back in LA. And this is when the fun really begins. Christa is a quirky, sarcastic, brilliant, funny woman. And her family is equally as quirky and bigger than life. I loved the writing, the setting, and the characters. Abbi Waxman is often snarky and tongue-in-cheek with her descriptions. Christa faced reconciling her past with her present so that she could progress into the future. I loved the environmental and biological descriptions. Christa's development and progression from being an introvert to becoming a full member of her family was great, and I could empathize. I can hardly wait for Abbi Waxman's next book. I know Father's Day is this month and a couple of new books I think dads would enjoy are Craig Johnson's newest Longmire and Greg Iles new Penn Cage novels. These are both great authors. 


