

Native American Identity From Past to Present: A More Perfect Union Theme

The Duncan Public Library in partnership with Oklahoma Humanities will host Let's Talk About It, Oklahoma! A series of book events centered around five amazing books presented by five amazing scholars at your favorite local library. Literature and popular media are littered with stereotypical and fantastical images and stories of Native American people, often painting them as people living in a mystical past or as a pure but vanishing race who remain on reservations, far removed from the rest of American society. This theme challenges this narrative by presenting Native American identity through the lens of Native writers and Native experiences. You can reserve a copy of each book with the library to read before each book discussion.

Well, some book friends are malicious and steer you wrong—and if they did it on purpose, they are no longer my book friends. With this book year in summary, I hope not to steer you wrong. I can't include all the books I have read, but this is a list for Christmas giving to your favorite bookworm. Here goes: For the fantasy reader, Rebecca Ross's Divine Rivals and Ruthless Vows. Also, the Crescent City trilogy by Sarah Maas is excellent for those who have read her A Court of Thorns and Roses series or even if they haven't.

For those who like current events, conspiracy theories, and spy thrillers—Daniel Silva's A Death in Cornwall and Greg Iles, The Southern Man. Lighter books are Abbi Waxman's Christa Comes Out of Her Shell and Emily Henry, Funny Story. Historical fiction Jacqueline Winspear's the White Lady was excellent as was Susan Elia MacNeal's The Last Hope. And Simon Sebag Montefiore's Moscow trilogy was one of the best things I read this year. For those who want history, I recommend Timothy Snyder's On Tyranny and Bloodlands. Both of these books are excellent and very timely. Mark Mazower's Dark Continents is about Europe in the 1930's and I highly recommend it to all those history aficionados. 


