Happy Valentine's Day to all. This month will be busy for me, but I wanted to discuss a semi-new author (to me) that I have been reading-Nora Roberts. I know she has been around for a long time, and I have read a couple of her recent series; however, while I was stocking the little free library, I happened to glance at one of her books and wound up reading it based on the synopsis. The book was Undercurrents, and it was fantastic. So I then picked up Sanctuary and was awestruck at the writing, characterization, plot, and setting. In fact, the whole book impressed me so much. It's about the Hathaway family of the Isle of Desire and Sanctuary, the family home. A family mystery causes dysfunction and pain for 20 years. The writing is reminiscent of Pat Conroy and Anne Rivers Siddons-two of my favorites. After finishing this book, I committed to reading more Nora Roberts-Tribute, The Witness, and Rivers End. These are all stand-alone reads, and each one holds its own. I think that anyone who likes Sandra Brown will enjoy these. As I said, I had enjoyed some of her series-Chronicles of the One and Dragon Heart Legacy and did like those. Plus I have three more Nora Roberts titles at home to read that I expect to be pretty good. I was sure to put back the first two that I borrowed from the little free library, so they are available for someone else to discover.
