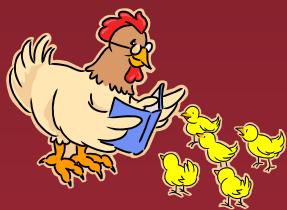
Health Screenings at McKell Branch

Library Information

All of the libraries are closed on Sunday. The libraries will be closed Monday September 5th for Labor Day and Thursday November 24th for Thanksgiving Day.

The Greenup County Public Library System is the best value for your money during these hard economic times. Read the latest best sellers in large print, regular print, or audio CD's. You can also check out movies or place a hold for a book on our website or call one of the library locations to place a hold. A call to the patron will be placed to inform them of the arrived hold. Each location in the system, except for the bookmobile, has public access computers. You must have your library card with you to be able to check items out or to use the computers. Wi-Fi (wireless internet) is also available. Anyone needing internet service can stop by the library. These services are all FREE!!

The libraries also have a notary, color copier and faxing services. These are offered for a small fee. If you have any questions about these services please contact your local library.

There are community meeting rooms available by reservation at all locations for clubs and organizations but not for private parties.

The Greenup Milling Company

Background

The land where the Greenup Milling Company building stands was part of the old Seaton farm. Samuel Seaton married Hannah Eddy and came to Greensburg from New Hampshire in 1815. He founded a private school known as the Seaton Academy.

Rebecca, the eldest daughter of Samuel and Hannah Eddy Seaton was born in 1826. She married Dr. Alfred Spaulding. Dr. Spaulding practiced medicine in Greensburg and the surrounding area for 34 years. He died in 1878 and is buried in Riverview Cemetery. In 1888, Rebecca Seaton Spaulding deeded a tract of land on Railroad Street to Robert Wilson and James Sowards. Rebecca moved back to New Hampshire to be near her sons: Dr. Alfred Spaulding, Jr. and Dr. George Spaulding. Rebecca died in 1896 and is buried next to her husband in Riverview Cemetery.

Rebecca Milling Company

Robert Wilson and James Sowards built a mill in 1888 on the land purchased from Rebecca Seaton Spaulding. The mill was named the Rebecca Milling Company. In 1889, William T. Hord bought James Soward's interest.

Greenup Milling Company

Robert Wilson, Sr. and sons purchased the Hord stock and changed the name to the Greenup Milling Company. The Wilson family operated the mill for the next sixty years. Robert Wilson, Sr. died in 1898. Robert Wilson, Jr. operated the mill until 1948. Robert Wilson, Jr. died in 1950.

Since 1950, the mill building has had a series of owners. It has housed various business ventures and apartments on the four floors.
